2013 Trash to Treasure Sale & Lunch


"One Person's Trash is Another's Treasure" TWO DAY SALE!!

Dear Members and Friends of Cottage Grove UCC,

Spring has arrived (almost)! The weather is warming (slowly), the grass is greening (well... browning may be a better description), and many plants,

trees, and flowers will soon be in bloom. Spring is the season of renewal and new life. It is no accident that the Easter season of the church finds its home in the heart of springtime. Eastertide, the six weeks between Easter Sunday and Pentecost, is in complete contrast to Lent. Lent is a time of confession, penance, and reflection while Eastertide is a season of hope, excitement, and possibility. Even though the Lenten season only encompasses 40 days, it seems so much longer because of the emotional and spiritual weight that accompanies it. That weight is lifted on Easter morning when, through the empty tomb, we are assured once again that life, not death, has the final word, and that Jesus Christ has guaranteed our salvation through his love and sacrifice. Through Christ's amazing act of love we are forgiven of our sins and set free to live life anew.

We talk a lot about spiritual disciplines in the church during Lent, but that seems to fade the rest of the year. During Lent we often deny ourselves certain luxuries or pleasures like chocolate or desserts. We may also refrain from doing specific activities during Lent, like smoking or watching television, and replace them with prayer and fasting to demonstrate our faithfulness to God. Once Lent is over, however, we often return to our "normal" mode of being.

Instead of slipping back into a normal, everyday, routine this Eastertide, let's try and do something each day that is life-giving to us, our families, our church, and our community. We can pray and read Scripture daily, cook a meal and share it with a neighbor or church member in need, volunteer at the local Humane Society walking dogs and cleaning kennels, enjoy a weekly game night with family and friends, or adopt a grandparent and visit them frequently. Even little things can bring new life to us and those around us this Eastertide. Smile more, be a good listener, or pray for a complete stranger. All of these things can help us show others that Christ is alive in our hearts and in our world today.

Peace to you all this Eastertide! Enjoy this blessed season! See you in worship. Pastor Bryan

Emily Olson and Whole Life Worship

God has blessed me with many ecumenical opportunities to share my gifts of music and ministry. I have learned much about worship, music, and the unique missions of many congregations and individuals. In the last few years, I have felt a calling from the Lord to share my experiences with others, and help peoples of faith deepen their life of worship and ministry.

After many months of discernment and prayer, I am beginning a music and worship ministry called Whole Life Worship (WLW).
